Dear Parents,

Please find enclosed brochures and enrolment form for our Children's Sacramental Program.

The program begins in June 2008 and concludes May 2009. It is a three stage process through which your child is prepared for and receives three sacraments: Confirmation, First Reconciliation and First Communion. The program is coordinated by Tanya Ceravolo and Mary Tobin and a team of parishioners/parish personnel.

Enrolments take place at the parish hall after all the Masses (except 7.30am) on the weekend of 21-22 June. You need to bring with you the completed enrolment form plus the other items mentioned in the brochure to this enrolment time. You will notice that the enrolment form asks you to nominate a Sponsor and a Confirmation name for your child. Please give this some thought and discuss it with your child before enrolment day. In the mean time, we would like to offer your child a little gift: a children's prayer book (enclosed). We encourage you to help your child to choose a prayer each day or each week, and to pray it with your child, or perhaps as a family. This would be a wonderful 'warm up' to your child's sacramental journey.

Your child must be a baptized Catholic in order to enter the Sacramental Program. If your child has not yet been baptized, please feel welcome to contact the parish to discuss your situation.
