Discernment Questions

(prior to Rite of Election)

What does a Catholic follower/disciple of Jesus 'look' like? Someone who:

- Belongs to the community of the Church (relationships).
- Prays to God
 - personal prayer
 - o communal prayer (especially Mass on Sundays)
- Listens to God's Word (Bible).
- Respects the teaching ministry of the church (Pope, Bishops).
- Receives the sacraments (sacred rituals).
- Models their life on the teachings of Jesus: love of God and neighbour.
- Lets go of anything that contradicts the teachings of Jesus (e.g. unloving or destructive habits).
- Reaches out in love to others.
- 1. Think about these different aspects of being a follower of Jesus:
 - i. In what area have I taken positive steps?
 - ii. In what area would I like to grow more?
- 2. Where do you feel that God is most active in your life at the moment?
- 3. What changes have you noticed in your life since being part of the Catechumenate (RCIA)?
- 4. What has been most valuable to you in your journey as a catechumen? What has been hardest?
- 5. How 'ready' do you feel at this time to receive the Sacraments and become a Catholic at Easter? Does becoming a Catholic feel very important to you? Or not so important at this time?
- 6. In learning about the Church and its traditions, what has been most helpful for you? What has given you most difficulty?
