Kids' Word

(during school term)

What is it?

Kids' Word is short for 'Children's Liturgy of the Word'. This is when the children leave the congregation to celebrate and reflect on the Gospel reading in an age appropriate way. The readings are the same as what the adult community is hearing in the church, but adapted to the children's level of understanding. At Our Lady of Dolours, we separate the children into 2 groups; 3-6 year olds and 6 year olds and up. We do this to better cater for the wide age range of children and their stages of faith development. Children under 3 are welcome to join the younger group with a parent. Kids' Word is rostered by parents within the community who lead and support the children during this time.

Why do it?

If you asked any parent why their child attends Kids' Word, you would probably hear:

- 'Because they enjoy it.'
- 'They like coming to mass when Kids' Word is on.'
- 'I can listen to the Word and homily without the children asking when it is time to go home.'

The reality is that attending Mass is part of being a Catholic family. Mass is a celebration of worship for the whole Catholic Family. Kids' Word is a way of helping children enter into this celebration more fully by catering to their specific age.

Other benefits of Kids' Word is to help form and build peer relationships within the parish community. The children who attend Our Lady of Dolours come from a wide area, many different schools and backgrounds. As a parish we want to create friendships to help build and sustain their faith as they grow. Kids' Word is one way in which we do this.

How to get involved

Just come along to Mass on the 2nd, 4th or 5th Sundays during school term. Your children can join the group when the priest invites them to the front. They will leave with the other children, and return in time for the Liturgy of the Eucharist (communion). Feel free to come along with your children so you know where they are, and to make sure they are settled.

The 9.00am Family Mass is our 'family friendly' Mass. It celebrates in a way that welcomes and supports the involvement of children and young families in the liturgy. Children are encouraged to enter into full participation in the Mass with the whole community. How? Here are some of the opportunities offered each month...

When	What
First Sunday of the month	A rostered family is in charge of co-ordinating the readings, prayers of the faithful and offertory procession. The Children's Choir and musicians sing and play at this Mass. Children are invited to the front for a child-friendly homily
Third Sunday of the month	Children are rostered to read the readings and write and read the Prayers of the Faithful. Children or a family are chosen for the offertory procession. The Children's Choir and musicians sing and play at this Mass. Children are invited to the front for a child friendly homily.
2nd, 4th and 5th Sundays during school term	Children are invited to the front of the church for Kids' Word which is their own special 'Liturgy of the Word'. Kids' Word children return for the offertory procession. Kids' Word children are invited to sit at the front until the priest invites them to join him for the Lord's Prayer
Every Sunday	Children are invited around the altar to recite the Lord's Prayer and return to parents after the Sign of Peace. Children can also help with collections if they wish.

As you can see, there are many ways for families with children to get involved in the 9.00am Family Mass. You may choose just one, or all!

The first step is to just come along and see it all unfold...

Co-ordinating Family Roster (First Sundays)

What is it?


This is a roster of families who wish to be involved in preparing and reading the Sunday readings and the prayers of the faithful at Mass. They also bring up the gifts at the offertory procession when rostered on.

Why do it?

We want to give families the opportunity of being involved in a way which can help them support each others' faith in the home environment. Preparing for this Mass at home, by deciding who will read, who will write prayers, who will do the offertory as well as practising their readings to each other are all ways to support each other.

This is a group of enthusiastic singers and musicians who play music and sing at Mass. The songs chosen are all child friendly and fun!


